COVID-19 Emergency Homelessness Funding Highlights

Cleaning and sanitizing supplies, disinfection and janitorial services, and personal protective equipment were provided in order to maintain a sanitary environment within shelters during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Security, meals, transportation, and sanitary supplies were provided for clients isolating in non-congregate shelter settings.

Approximately 2,000 hygiene kits were distributed to Street Outreach programs to be provided when engaging those experiencing unsheltered homelessness.

Handwashing stations and portable toilets were provided throughout Fresno County, including the Cities of Mendota, Firebaugh, Biola, and Fresno to help mitigate the spread of COVID-19.
